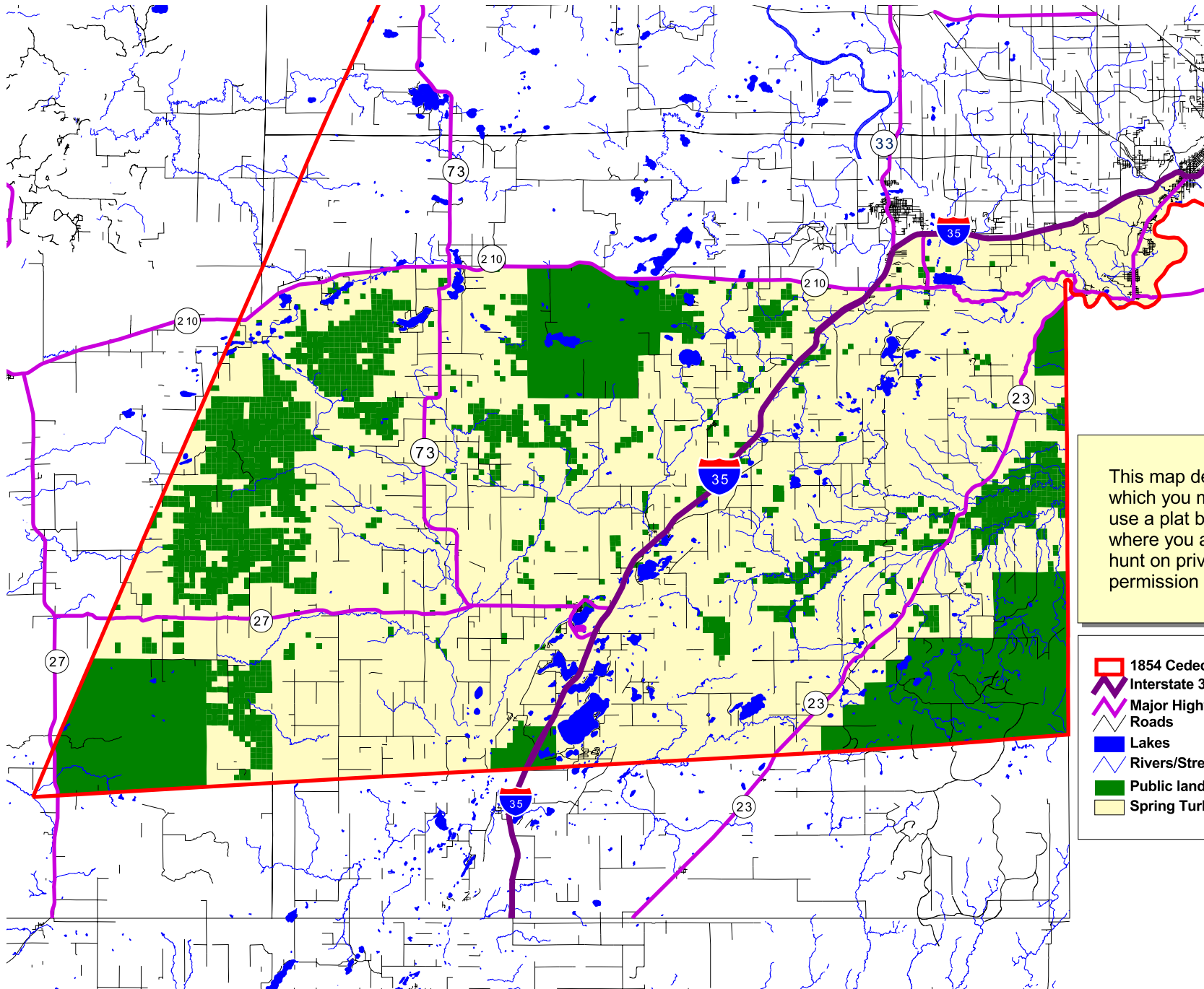


1854 Treaty Authority SPRING 2010 WILD TURKEY Season Information

- License Requirement:** 1854 Ceded Territory ID Card.
- Bag Limit:** One (1) bearded turkey for season.
- Hunting Hours:** One-half hour before sunrise to sunset
- Age Limit:** Hunters under 16 must have a valid firearms safety certificate in their possession. Hunters under 14 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, but that parent or guardian does not need their own license if they are not hunting.
- Method of Take:** Shotgun or Archery
- Shotguns: must be .20 gauge or larger; only shot size #4 and smaller diameter may be used; no firearms discharging a single projectile may be used for hunting turkeys
- Archery: Arrowheads must be broadheads that are of barbless design and have a minimum of two cutting edges at least 7/8" diameter at, or upon, impact.
- Registration:** NO Registration required.
- Other restrictions:** You may not hunt turkeys with live turkey decoys, dogs, or bait.
- Blaze Orange:** Turkey hunters are exempt from small game blaze orange requirements, however we recommend that you wear blaze orange while traveling to and from your hunting spot.
- Permit Availability:** NO special permits required.
- 2010 Season Dates:** April 14 – May 27, 2010
- Open area:** The portion of the 1854 Ceded Territory lying south of Interstate 35 and Highway 210.
